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Sanitary Sewer Rehabilitation work in the Town of Pendleton – Project Update

The Fall Creek Regional Waste District (FCRWD) is in the process of making improvements to portions of its sanitary sewer system within the Town of Pendleton. The purpose of this project is to improve the performance of the sewer system, extend its service life and reduce the amount of extraneous water that enters the pipes. The project includes replacing and or lining the mainline sewers and replacing many of the older individual service lines on customer's private property.

Currently, we are getting ready to start the construction of Phase II of the project which will last through the summer of 2018.

Phase II includes most of the areas surrounding and south of downtown Pendleton. A map showing the locations affected by the project is posted on our website @ www.fcrwd.com.

In addition to work on the sewer mains, many of the properties in the project areas with older sewer laterals will also have these pipes replaced all the way to the building. There is a temporary easement form that needs to be signed by the property owner for the District to complete this work. If you have received one of these forms from us and not signed it, please sign and return as soon as possible so that your property can be included in this work.
